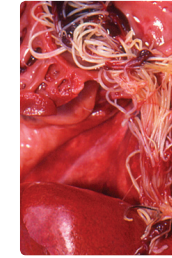

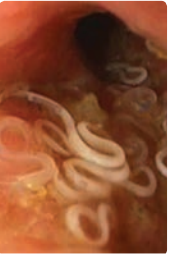
HEARTWORM

- One bite from an infected mosquito can infect your dog
- Treatment is difficult, costly and may cause complications
- Symptoms include coughing, sluggishness and difficulty breathing; some dogs may show no signs at all



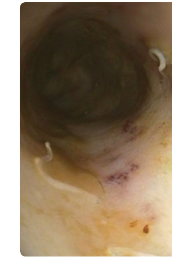
WHIPWORM

- Contracted by dogs ingesting infective eggs from soil or contaminated/infested matter
- Eggs can stay alive in the soil for several years
- Symptoms include bloody diarrhea, dehydration and weight loss



HOOKWORM

- Infective microscopic larvae can penetrate the skin or are ingested by your dog on infected soil or feces
- Symptoms may include bloody diarrhea, weight loss and anemia



TAPEWORM

- Typically acquired by ingesting larvae residing in a host such as fleas, rodents or rabbits
- White or cream-coloured segments can show up in a dog's feces or under its tail; dogs may bite anal area to relieve irritation
- Visible to the human eye and look like small grains of rice near the tail of the dog



ROUNDWORM

- Most puppies inherit roundworms from their mother
- Eggs can remain infective in soil for years
- Symptoms include diarrhea, vomiting, stunted growth and bloated belly
