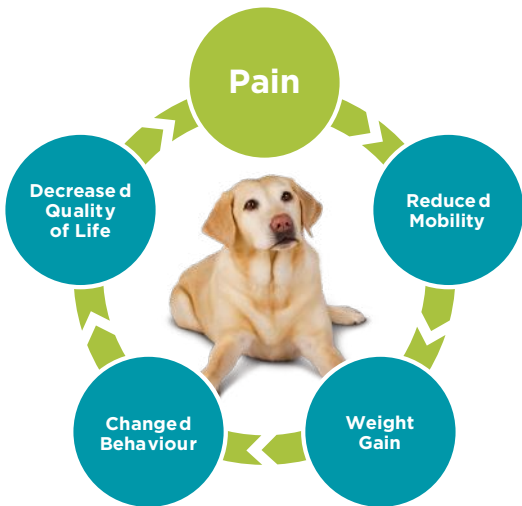
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ARTHRITIS AND YOUR DOG

Arthritis is a condition that leads to pain and progressive degeneration of the joint. It affects many aspects of a dog's wellbeing including limited mobility, painful joints, disrupted sleep patterns, decreased social interactions and an overall reduced quality of life.

Signs can often be subtle, and dogs will rarely yelp, cry, or vocalize the pain they are experiencing. It is therefore important to look out for limping, slowing down on walks, difficulty in rising and hesitating when jumping. These are all signs your dog may be experiencing pain. New evidence shows that the condition can affect dogs of all sizes, ages and breeds. **Dogs don't have to suffer the pain of arthritis—no matter their age.**



Fortunately there is a new therapy available to help keep your dog comfortable and enjoying a good quality of life for as long as possible!

WHAT IS LIBRELA[®] AND HOW DOES IT WORK?

LIBRELA is an innovative therapy called a Monoclonal Antibody. It targets and neutralizes nerve growth factor (NGF), a protein that stimulates pain in dogs with arthritis.

Through this action, one LIBRELA injection alleviates pain for a full month without the potential side effects associated with other types of drugs.



WHAT CAN I EXPECT FROM MY DOG'S TREATMENT WITH LIBRELA?



Increased mobility and decreased levels of pain.



Positive effect in your dog's quality of life.



Long lasting pain relief for a full month.



LIBRELA can be used with other common therapies*

*Examples include: vaccines, flea & tick products, dewormers, antibiotics and nutritional supplements.

HOW IS LIBRELA GIVEN?

LIBRELA is administered by a member of your veterinary team as a monthly subcutaneous injection.



HOW MANY INJECTIONS OF LIBRELA WILL MY DOG NEED?

If your veterinarian has prescribed LIBRELA, it means that your dog has been diagnosed with arthritis and is in pain. Arthritis is a life-long disease which may progress over time. Fortunately, it can be effectively managed with the help of LIBRELA. It is therefore important to maintain your dog's monthly visits to ensure he/she remains comfortable, and maintains a good quality of life.

More than one monthly injection may be needed before reaching the desired efficacy. Your veterinary team may also recommend a change in your dog's exercise and diet.
